

2007 House Vote Descriptions

1. Raising the Minimum Wage

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House approved a bill (H.R. 2) to raise the minimum wage from its current \$5.15 an hour to \$7.25 in three steps over the next 26 months.

House Vote Number 18

AFSCME supported the bill, which the House passed by a vote of 315-116 on January 10, 2007.

2. Lowering Prescription Drug Prices

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House approved the Medicare Prescription Drug Price Negotiation Act (H.R. 4), which requires Medicare to negotiate for lower prescription drug prices.

House Vote Number 23

AFSCME supported the bill, which the House passed by a vote of 255-170 on January 12, 2007.

3. Protecting an Employee's Right to Join a Union

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House approved the Employee Free Choice Act (H.R. 800), which would make it easier for workers to form a union and weaken management's ability to stop organizing drives with anti-union tactics.

House Vote Number 118

AFSCME supported the bill, which the House passed by a vote of 241-185 on March 1, 2007.

4. Supporting Domestic Needs at Home

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House passed the U.S. Troop Readiness, Veterans' Health, and Iraq Accountability Act, or Iraq Supplemental (H.R. 1591), which

provided critical support to our troops in Iraq and Afghanistan. In addition, H.R. 1591 provided funding for urgent needs at home such as children's health care, low-income heating assistance, food and nutritional aid, homeland security, pandemic flu and more.

House Vote Number 186

AFSCME supported the bill, which the House passed by a vote of 218-212 on March 23, 2007.

5. Preventing Harmful Budget Cutbacks

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House passed the fiscal year 2008 budget plan (S. Con. Res. 21), which begins to reverse six years of harmful cuts to a wide range of domestic programs administered by state and local governments, including new funding for the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP), veterans' programs, special education, No Child Left Behind, child care, Pell grants and other pressing domestic needs.

House Vote Number 377

AFSCME supported the conference report, which the House passed by a vote of 214-209 on May 17, 2007.

6. Giving Public Safety Officers Collective Bargaining Rights

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House passed the Public Safety Employer-Employee Cooperation Act (H.R. 980), which extends collective bargaining rights to public safety officers who do not currently have the right in their state to engage in such activities.

House Vote Number 633

AFSCME supported the bill, which the House passed by a vote of 314-97 on July 17, 2007.

7. Weakening Medicare Benefits for Seniors

AFSCME Position: No

The House rejected an amendment by Rep. David Camp (R-MI) to the fiscal year 2009 funding bill for the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education (H.R. 3043), that would have preserved the so-called “Medicare Advantage” law that is giving away \$160 billion in overpayments to private insurance companies if they provide seniors with a private plan as an alternative to traditional Medicare benefits, thus weakening Medicare and harming many minority, low-income, rural and union member insurers.

House Vote Number 675

AFSCME opposed the amendment to the bill, which the House rejected by a vote of 192-228 on July 19, 2007.

8. Helping Victims of Employment Discrimination

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House approved the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act of 2007 (H.R. 2831), a bill that would reverse a Supreme Court decision limiting the time that workers have to sue their employers for pay discrimination.

House Vote Number 768

AFSCME supported the bill, which the House passed by a vote of 225-199 on July 31, 2007.

9. Investing in Children’s Health and Medicare Protection

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House passed the Children’s Health and Medicare Protection Act of 2007 (H.R. 3162), which would authorize \$86 billion over five years for the State Children’s Health Insurance Program (SCHIP) to maintain coverage for almost 7 million children, reach another 5.1 million who

currently lack coverage and make significant improvements to Medicare, such as increasing access to low-income assistance programs and providing more equitable payments for private Medicare Advantage plans.

House Vote Number 787

AFSCME supported the bill, which the House passed by a vote of 225-204 on August 1, 2007.

10. Preserving a Tax Cut for the Wealthy

AFSCME Position: No

The House rejected a motion to recommit the Tax Collection Responsibility Act (H.R. 3056) and add to it a repeal of the federal estate tax, which would provide an expensive tax break for the wealthy and undermine funding for education, health care, public safety, and other vital public services.

House Vote Number 959

AFSCME opposed the motion, which the House rejected by a vote of 196-212 on October 10, 2007.

11. Preventing Privatization of IRS Tax Collection

AFSCME Position: Yes

The House approved the Tax Collection Responsibility Act of 2007 (H.R. 3056), which would ban the federal government from contracting out to private (non-IRS) tax collection agencies.

House Vote Number 960

AFSCME supported the bill, which the House passed by a vote of 232-173 on October 10, 2007.
