How to Judge a Member's Voting Record

Congressional Scorecard



AFSCME selects a few roll-call votes from the hundreds cast by members of Congress every session. In choosing these votes, AFSCME attempts to fairly represent a lawmaker's position on issues determined to be important to AFSCME members — first and foremost as workers, but also as citizens and union brothers and sisters.

This voting scorecard is one of the key factors used in making judgments on AFSCME campaign support, endorsements or contributions from PEOPLE — AFSCME's Political Action Committee or PAC. Other important factors often include the member's official leadership position, chairmanship or seniority on important committees, leadership in a state's congressional delegation, and accessibility and responsiveness to AFSCME's lobbying efforts.

2013 House Vote Descriptions

1. Super Storm Sandy Aid AFSCME Position: YES

The Super Storm Sandy relief bill (H.R. 152) provided more than \$50 billion for communities hit by the storm. Most of the funds were to rebuild the homes and businesses destroyed by the storm, as well as funding for rebuilding and improving the transportation systems or help for flood control and shore-strengthening projects to lessen the impact of future storms. The bill passed on Jan. 15 by a vote of 241-180 (R: 49-179; D: 192-1). Roll Call vote 23.

2. Raising the Minimum Wage to \$10.10 AFSCME Position: YES

On the House bill to reauthorize the Workforce Investment Act (H.R. 803), which would have consolidated 35 employment and training programs, Rep. George Miller (D-CA) offered

an amendment to clarify that nothing in the bill would repeal, deny or loosen existing protections, training and educational opportunities. The amendment would also increase the federal minimum wage to \$10.10 within two years of the bill's enactment. The amendment was rejected on March 15 by a vote of 184-233 (R: 0-227; D: 184-6). Roll Call vote 74.

3. Cutting and Consolidating Job Training Programs AFSCME Position: NO

H.R. 803 would reauthorize the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) and would consolidate 35 employment and training programs into a single funding stream for state and local use, eliminate some services and cut WIA job training by at least 10%. The bill also contained provisions to reduce the amount of labor representation on the Workforce Development Boards. The bill passed on March 15 by a vote of 215-202 (R: 213-14; D: 2-188). Roll Call vote 75.

4. The Ryan Budget AFSCME Position: NO

Rep. Paul Ryan (R-WI) again authored a budget plan (H.Con.Res. 25) that would require deep sacrifices by working families, senior citizens and other vulnerable Americans while providing additional tax cuts to corporations and the rich. The plan would have made large cuts in Medicaid, ended Medicare as we know



it by converting it into a voucher program, and would have repealed the Affordable Care Act. In addition, it would have required deep cuts to job training, education, food assistance, housing, legal services and advanced technology vehicle manufacturing programs. The budget resolution passed on March 21 by a vote of 221-207 (R: 221-10; D: 0-197). Roll Call vote 88.

5. Restricting the NLRB AFSCME Position: NO

H.R. 1120 would effectively shut down the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) and needlessly place the rights of millions of American workers in jeopardy. The NLRB remedies unfair labor practices and defends the right of employees to join a union and bargain collectively with private sector employers. Shutting the NLRB down would leave employees with no place to go to ensure their bargaining rights under the law are enforced. The bill passed on April 12 by a vote of 219-209 (R: 219-10; D: 0-199). Roll Call vote 101.

6. Reforming Overtime and “Comp” Time AFSCME Position: NO

The so-called Working Families Flexibility Act (H.R. 1406) provided flexibility for employers, not employees. The bill would allow employers to provide workers with compensatory time off in lieu of time and half overtime pay. But, the “comp time” could only be used at the employer’s discretion and the bill provided no protection from employer discrimination for workers who would rather be paid overtime instead of comp time. The bill passed on

May 8 by a vote of 223-204 (R: 220-8; D: 3-196). Roll Call vote 137.

7. Repealing the Affordable Care Act AFSCME Position: NO

Though the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that the Affordable Care Act (ACA) was constitutional, the House has held dozens of votes to repeal all or part of the health care reform law. The ACA improves access to affordable health care coverage, provides consumer protections, and stops insurance company abuses. If repealed, 1.2 million young adults would lose their coverage through their parents’ health plan; 2.7 million seniors would pay higher prices for prescription drugs; 44 million seniors would be denied free preventive services; and insurance companies would be allowed to resume denying coverage, limiting care and spending premiums on larger CEO salaries and profits. This version of repeal passed on May 16 by a vote of 229-195 (R: 227-0; D: 2-195). Roll Call vote 154.

8. Cuts to Nutrition Assistance (SNAP) AFSCME Position: NO

After failing to pass the farm bill in the House, the House passed a separate bill (H.R. 3102) to cut \$40 billion from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)—food stamps—over the next ten years. It would also reduce states’ flexibility on waivers and increase qualification requirements. These cuts would affect a broad array of Americans who are struggling to make ends meet, including working families with children, senior citizens, veterans and adults who are still looking for work. The bill passed on Sept. 19 by a vote of 217-210 (R: 217-15; D: 0-195). Roll Call vote 476.
